## PALM SUNDAY MUSIC GOOD

SPECIAL SERVICES AND MUSIC  
TOMORROW.

Coming Week Will Be Replete With  
Many Devout Services.

Palm Sunday will be fittingly observed in La Grande. In the Presbyterian Church there is mourning, but nevertheless services will be held. The Episcopal and Catholic churches each have special music appropriate to the occasion, and special solos will be heard in nearly all the churches. The palms will be sung in the Episcopal church as an offertory by Elsworth Ellis and in the Methodist Church in the morning by L. D. Howland. The Catholic Church palm Sunday music calls for a plain chant, Gregorian, in the morning.

Tomorrow commences the last week of Lent, designated as Holy week and special services for these seven days so holy and sacred to religion, are announced. Rev. Upton H. Gibbs announces the following schedule of services for the week:
