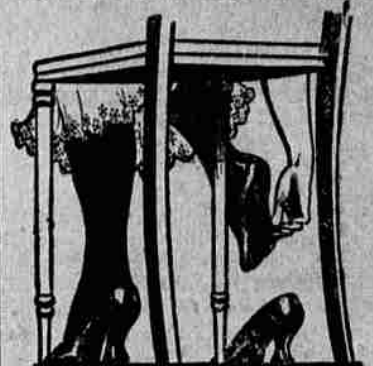
He is wooed by the tunefulness of this friendly instrument and arises with music in his soul to begin the day cheerful and happy.
