Wallowa, Apr 4.—(Special).—Friday afternoon at 3:00 p. m., thirteen High School students entered in competition for class honors in the Cross-Country run, the Sophomores winning the honors. Starting at the school house they followed a course to Pratt's ranch returning the same way making a course of about 3 miles. The time was 15 minutes.
