The jury as chosen consists of Krank King of Pendleton, William T. Reeves of Stanford, Luther Spellman of Baker, S. R. Hayworth of La Grande, John B. Frazier of Milton, K. McCrea of Pendleton, B. Bates of Union, J. T. Henner of Haines, R. D. Hamilton of Hilgard, Charles L. Low of Pleasant Valley, A. V. Andrews of La Grande and H. O. Mitchell of Baker.

Deputy District United States Attorney E. A. Johnson, who prosecuted the Columbia George case, is conducting the government's case today but his chief, Clarence L. Reames, is at his side. Instead of Col. J. H. Raley defending Dupuis, James B. Perry is conducting the defense.

Dupuis is alleged to have testified falsely at the Columbia George trial in declaring that he had not seen the accused Indian in his store on the day of the murder.

Beckwith identified the records which he had made of the testimony in the previous trial. Toy testified to having been with Columbia George in the Dupuis store on the morning of the day of the murder. Dozier testified to having seen George, Toy, Andrew Barnhardt and others in the Dupuis store on the same morning and of having discussed the incident with Dupuis following the discovery of the murder. Barnhart, who is himself to be tried at this term for adultery, testified to having been with the other Indians in Dupuis' store.

The defense is seeking to impeach the government's witnesses from the records of the Columbia George trial.
