MYSTERY ISLANDS

Some of the World's Black Spots That Defy White Men.

HAVE NEVER BEEN EXPLORED.

Their Inhospitable Shores or Savage Natives Bar the Way to Those Who Would Learn Their Secrets—Fate of Expeditions to Tiburon.

Leaving out of consideration the still unexplored portions of the arctic and antarctic regions—and there are millions of square miles of them—there are many spots on this little globe of ours that have yet to become familiar with the face of a white man and to smile or frown upon the fearless and hardy pathfinder.

New Guinea is one of the few countries that still present untrodden fields for the explorer, but there are a number of islands that remain a mystery to the world at large and that will probably so remain for many years to come.

One of these isles of mystery is Tiburon Island, where not so long ago an explorer met his fate. His name was Wayne, and he is said to have been a clever mining expert.

Wayne went across to Tiburon in October, and not a trace has since been seen of him, nor is it likely that his fate will ever be known.

He was warned of the dangers that were before him. In spite of offers of double pay he could not get a soul to accompany him, so he crossed Hell's passage alone and, like all others who have preceded him, has never come back.

Tiburon is no lonely island in savage Melanesia. It lies in the gulf of California, separated from the Mexican mainland by only a few miles of salt water.

Yet it remains one of the world's black spots. It has never yet been explored by white men. Its only inhabitants are a tribe of Indians who, armed with bows and arrows dipped in some unknown but deadly poison, shoot down all who try to land.

The expedition of 1879 vanished into the interior and was never seen again, and the same fate befell the party headed by Professor Millies in 1904.

There is only one other island in all the world which can match Tiburon, and that is Malaya in the Solomons. Match it—that is, in the way of savagery. And even in Malaya there are white men on the coast. Valuable plantations of coconuts and other tropical produce have been planted on the shores of Malaya, but inland is a mountainous country covered with thick bush and inhabited by fierce tribes of cannibals.

Gold is believed to exist in the interior of Malaya, and more than one expedition has been organized to search for the precious metal. But the bushmen, who steal noiselessly as serpents through the tropical forest, have wiped out every one of the explorers, and their smoke dried heads decorate the dark temples in the central mountains.

Other islands there are which are as impregnable as Tiburon and Malaya, but for different reasons. One such is Tromelin, a lonely spot of land thirty miles north of Mauritius. It is surrounded by a terrific rampart of coral, which is fully 150 yards wide. A mile out on any side of the island the sea is from 10,000 to 12,000 feet deep. The surf, which always breaks on the rocky fence of this submarine mountain top, makes landing practically impossible.

Yet it was here that in 1761 a French transport was wrecked, and 110 survivors out of over 800 aboard got ashore alive. Of these, seven, all black women, were rescued in the year 1776, having by some amazing miracle kept life in themselves for a space of fifteen months, with no food but shellfish and no drink but brackish water.

In the year 1907 that famous navigator, Henry Hudson, reported the existence of a rock island 300 miles east of Greenland. It was named Jan Mayen. That island was never seen again until the year 1860, when a party of English people, among whom was Lord Dufferin, caught a glimpse of it. Then it vanished for another fifty years, to be seen once more in July, 1910, by the tourists aboard the yachting liner Oceana.

No one has ever set foot on Jan Mayen. No one is ever likely to, for no navigator would willingly approach it. It is the center of the thickest fogs on the surface of this planet, and from one year's end to another usually remains totally invisible.

Bouvet Island, in the antarctic, is almost equally inaccessible. It is the summit of a dead volcano, which rises steeply from immensely deep water, and it has been sighted only twice since its discovery in 1739.

Once and once only has man set foot upon it. A boat from the German exploring ship Valdivia landed, but the people found exploration impossible. The rocky sides were not only of appalling steepness, but they were literally coated with smooth ice, making climbing a matter of impossibility.
