DRAGS READY FOR D. W. KING

TWO HAVE BEEN CONSTRUCTED FOR DEMONSTRATION.

Scheme Is Simplicity Itself—Demonstrations to Be Made.

KING DATES SET.

D. Ward King will be in Elgin April 30, in Union May 1 and in La Grande May 2. Demonstrations will be held at each place.

Two road drags have been constructed in Tom Flemming's blacksmith shop to be used when D. Ward King the wizard road builder for little money, comes to La Grande for the purpose of showing the citizens of the county that the subject of good roads is not so bad or as hopelessly involved in finances as many suppose it to be. If this instrument does what its inventor says it will do, and others in many states have testified that it does more than he claims for it, then the problem may be looked upon as partly solved. All that is required then is a split log made after the manner of the Ward King road drag, two good horses, persistence, good will, and the average road, impassible during many parts of the year, will become like a paved boulevard.

This drag is constructed in the following manner: A log about nine or twelve inches in diameter is sawed in half from end to end. These are then braced together so that the flat side of one log is in front and the flat side of the other half log is in the back. They are about two feet apart. The left end of the front log projects about a foot beyond that of the log in the rear, and the other end is fastened so that the chain will hold the log down to the ground. In this manner when the drag is in operation the dirt is moved to the center and whatever small holes remain are filled by the loose earth that is scraped from the road.

In speaking of this kind of road making a Maine man speaks as follows:

"I began April 28, 1906, when the mud was two to eight inches deep. Within three hours teams passed at a trot without sinking half the depth of the hoof or burying a wheel rim. Although the frost was not wholly out of the ground, and in spite of the repeated and heavy rains of June, there has not been a day, nor even one hour when the preceding sentence would not be a correct description."

CONTRARY FORCES.

Problem of a Bullet Fired From the Rear of a Moving Train.

Replying to the question, "Supposing to use an overdrawn illustration, that a railroad train was going forward at the rate of 100 miles per minute and a gun was fired from the rear of the train in the opposite direction. If the velocity of the bullet as it left the gun would also have been 100 miles per minute had the gun been discharged by a person standing on solid ground, would the bullet leave the gun at all, and if so, at what rate of speed?" Edgar Lucien Larkin in the New York American says:
"The bullet would leave the muzzle of the gun with a speed of 100 miles per minute; the force of the explosive in the gun is the cause of the motion of the bullet, not that of the train. At the exact end of one minute the rear of the train and the bullet would be 200 miles apart. Before the gun is fired the bullet is moving with the train; at time of firing the bullet is at rest during an infinitesimal of time or a differential of time. The time is between the stopping of the motion of the bullet with the train and beginning of motion from the train is mathematically called a consecutive state and is such an important element of human knowledge that the highest branch of mathematics, the differential calculus, only is able to completely explore its wonderful properties."
