

DAVIS LIKES SINGLE TAX

PRESENT SYSTEM UNSATISFACTORY HE SAYS.

Produces Clipping Dealing With Single Taxation Question.

Ex-City Councilman E. C. Davis in discussing taxation which is now one of the leading topics, remarked to the Observer: "I am a single-taxer and the longer I live the more I am convinced it is the only safe and sane way of taxing property."

Continuing, Mr. Davis said: "There is scarcely a man who is satisfied with the present scheme of taxation. Everyone knows it is weak and in many places wrong and unfair, but people have been taught that single tax is such a bugbear they will not listen to its reasoning, neither will they study its plan."

Mr. Davis then produced an extract from single tax newspaper to back up his contention which follows:

A Massachusetts tax ferret recently wrote to the tax bodies of many populous communities offering to assist them in perfecting their lists of assessments. He proposed, \$1 a name, to furnish lists of the complete personal property holdings of all persons in each community. In this way he said he had served communities in Massachusetts, which sought to levy on all manner of property.

J. J. Pastoriza, for the Board of Assessors of Houston, Texas, replied as follows:

"I have your letter offering to secure assessments of personal property and charge \$1 per name for same. In reply will state that this city has ceased to act in the capacity of a thief. We do not tax personal property; we consider it common, every-day stealing, to take in the form of tax any part of that which a man earns himself. The land values of Houston produce more revenue than we need and we don't have to subject our citizens to the ordeal of the seventh degree, or put them in a position where they will have to lie, perjure themselves, and send their souls to Hell. If you will read 'Progress and Poverty' by Henry George, you will get a line on what I am talking about."

This indicates the success of the plan adopted in Houston and other cities, whereby a tax is levied which automatically reaches all classes of property, and without friction produces sufficient money for public needs.
