**APPEAL IN COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL CASE TAKEN.**

Case Involving Wallowa County High School Revived.

Attorneys Wallace G. Trill, of Wallowa, and A. W. Schaupp, of Joseph, were in the city Saturday conferring with Attorneys Cochran & Eberhard regarding the brief of Wallowa county in the supreme court in the case known as the "Wallowa county high school case." The attorneys mentioned were retained by the county court of Wallowa county last Summer when the district attorney felt inclined to submit without argument the case involving the right of the county to retain possession of the county high school and the grounds furnished the county on which to build the institution after the county institution of learning had been discontinued. Judge Anderson, of Baker, sitting for Judge Knowles, decided in favor of the county on the brief furnished by the special counsel and they are now preparing for the final round on the appeal to the higher court. County Attorney Corkins appears with the special counsel on the appeal.
