Portland, April 21 (Special)—Compared with a week ago, there was a smaller run in all lines of livestock at North Portland at the opening of the week with the exception of calves, which showed a liberal increase.

Market for cattle showed a continuance of the excellent feeling for light stuff of finished quality.

For ordinary quality the market was less favorable, although it showed no further gain of weakness. Killers are discriminating more and more against the ordinary to poor offerings, and are lending encouragement to those who are turning out superior quality.
