Profit in Arresting Deserters.

"The members of the police department are continually on the watch for deserters from the army or navy," explained the man about town. "The reason is that the government sets a price of \$25 upon the deserter's head. Of course policemen are anxious to gain the reward and are on the watch. "The Bowery is the district most frequented by deserters, and that is the first place in the city where search is made for them. A score of deserters are picked up along this thoroughfare every year. "Before a member of the police department can accept the reward for catching a deserter his claim must be approved by the commissioner. Even then he does not draw the entire amount, for the usual deduction for the police pension fund is made."—New York Sun.
