Watch the Clock.

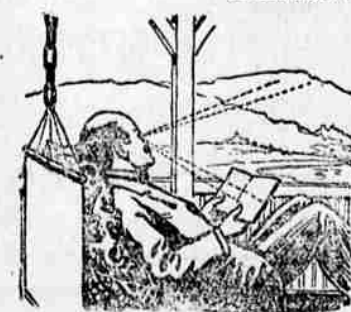
