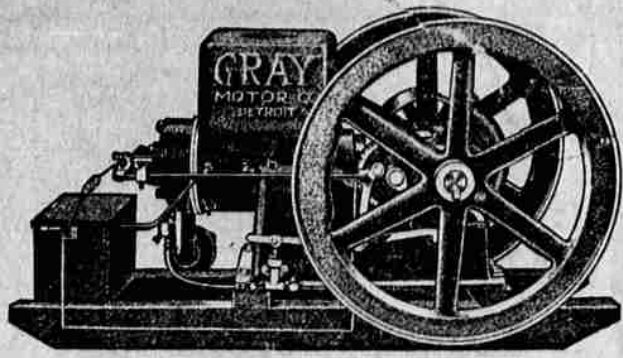

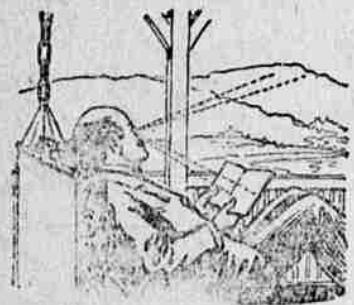

INDUSTRIAL CLASSES FORM

LA GRANDE SCHOOLS THOROUGHLY ORGANIZED.

Little Folks Will Strive to Attain Big Trip to Frisco.

Industrial Field Worker, N. C. Maris, of the state department of education, is spending the week in the county assisting Superintendent A. E. Ivanhoe in the organization of industrial clubs in the public schools.

They are meeting with great success, the teachers co-operating and the pupils responding enthusiastically. A club has been organized in every school they have visited. In fact Mr. Maris says, a club has been organized in every school he has visited in the nine counties he has worked.

He says there can be no doubt about the wisdom of the club plan introduced by the State Superintendent J. A. Churchill and co-operated in by the Oregon Agricultural College. The idea of effecting and conducting an organization like grown-ups appeals to the boys and girls. The idea of learning to do and of doing the work that grown-ups are doing—doing a man's job or a woman's job, and receiving commensurate compensation, appeals to them. The opportunity to win one of the capital prizes in a free trip to the Panama-Pacific International Exposition at San Francisco, appeals to them. The fact that other boys and girls are doing the same thing—that other schools throughout the state and in other states are organizing clubs, that it is the popular thing and "everybody's doing it," appeals to the child very strongly and makes the Industrial Club movement a very popular one.

There are six of these clubs in La Grande, two in the Central Building, two in the Rivera school, one each in the high school and the Greenwood school. The officers in the Central school for the 6th, 7th and 8th grades are, president, Geo. McDonald; vice-pres., Arnold Ferrin; secretary, Gladys Moore; treasurer, Ralph Westering; advisors, Mrs. Bullard, Mrs. Schilke and J. H. Rudd.

The officers for the 4th, 5th and 6th grade organization are, president, Frank Black; vice-president, Marcella Berry; secretary, Alladine Scroggin; treasurer, Norma Mayger. The advisor for this body is Professor Prince.

The 6th, 7th and 8th grade organization in the Rivera school has the following officers: president, Wesley McCrary; vice-pres., Grace Swalberg; secretary, Minnie Johnson; treasurer, Dewey Stansfield; advisor, Mrs. Nellie Neill.

The 4th and 5th grade organization is officered by these little people: President, Evelyn Smith vice-pres., Geo. Ball; secretary, Gertrude Garner; treasurer, Glosson Shireman, advisor, Miss Grace Snook.

The officers of the high school organization are as follows: President, Earl Reynolds; vice-pres., Lenore Hughey; secretary, Kenneth Keeney; treasurer, Lester Stoddard; advisors, Mrs. Sara Riddle and Ed. Reynolds.

The Greenwood officers are, President, Dan Cope; vice-president, Minnie Bunday; secretary, Myrtle Brixley; treasurer, Ralph Collier; advisor, Mr. Connor, principal of the school.

Mr. Maris states that all of the children have taken readily to the idea and that the parents should expect some very good fruits of this movement in this city. So far 511 children have been enrolled in these clubs.
