

BEEF HOLDS HIGH MARKS

SHEEP ALONE FAILED TO HOLD THEIR OWN.

Wool Sales in Morrow County Bring 16 to 19 Cents for 1914 Clips.

Union Stockyards, April 27.—The cattle market opened strong this morning, with prime steers selling up to \$8.25, the highest price reached at any time during last week. Receipts were heavy and the demand good. In the sheep house prices were not maintained. Hogs held their own, continuing at \$8.70 top.

Pendleton, April 28.—With the sale by contract of not less than a dozen Morrow county wool clips at prices ranging from 16 to 19 cents the Eastern Oregon wool market has just gone through the greatest activity this season. Fine wool sold uniformly at 16 cents while coarse wool went as high as 19. The buying was done by W. W. Smead, Heppner agent for
