BIG SHIPMENT OF STOCK DUE

LOCAL MAN GOES TO MONTANA
FOR MORE CATTLE.

Probably Biggest Importation to
Eastern Oregon Yet Known.

Frank Stilwell left today for Dillon, Montana, to load a thousand steers and cows for shipment to the Grande Ronde valley. He returned some time ago with 12 cars of cattle for this valley and Baker county, and is now going back to bring the rest of his purchase made on the first trip. He is due to arrive about May 12 with several trains. This it is thought will be the largest individual shipment of cattle ever brought into this section of Eastern Oregon at one time.

He states sheep men and dry farming are driving cattle men out of the Montana country, owing to the limiting of the range.
