ARRANGEMENTS FOR MEET STILL UNCERTAIN.

Those Who Would Join Special Train
Crowd Should Speak Out.

Just what accommodations will be provided for the track team and fans who desire to attend the annual Eastern Oregon track meet at Wallowa next Saturday, have not been determined. If a sufficient number—50—agree to attend from this city, a special train will be provided but otherwise the teams must remain in Wallowa until the following afternoon. The various athletes from Eastern Oregon are routed through and if possible the O.-W. will be persuaded to give allowances for these 50 or 60 on the La Grande special. All those desiring to attend the meet or a special train basis should notify the superintendent's office at once.

Lack of Funds Proving Embarrassing
Pendleton, April 29.—Coach Asbahr of the Pendleton high school track team, is much perplexed these days and his heart is not joyous. For the first time in four years he has what he believes is a championship track team, one that could take the Eastern Oregon honors in a walk, and yet he is confronted with the probability that he can enter but a small part of his winners. An empty student body exchequer will not permit him to take the fifteen sure point winners he has to the Eastern Oregon meet at Wallowa next Friday and he is longing for the powers of an alchemist to turn pig iron into ingots of pure gold.

It will require about \$75 to send the fifteen men over but that sum looms large to the student body treasurer who has already felt the drain of bringing the Baker and Astoria debaters here. Unless some means of raising money is found between now and Thursday, Asbahr will have to take over four or five of his best men and leave the rest behind. Word comes from Baker and La Grande that they will enter teams of 20 and this is not reassuring to the local coach.

Here are the fifteen men Coach Asbahr would like to take with him and who, he feels certain would take points: Captain Straughn in the hurdles and jumps, Brock, sprints, Knight, sprints and broad jump, Siebert, sprints and broad jump, Peters, same, Bowman, sprints, Curl, 440 and 880, Osborne, pole vault, Ried, distances, Friedley, Hall and Kerriek, weights, Mims, javelin and weights, Minnis and Anderson, mile run.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED STREET IMPROVEMENT.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You are hereby notified that the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, to make an examination of the property, upon which assessments are to be levied to pay the costs and expenses of the street improvement hereinafter described, as to the valuation and extent, if any of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvement, have made their report in writing to said council, which report has been received by said Commission and is on file in the office of the Recorder of said city, and is open for your inspection. That it is the intention of said Commission to levy a special assessment against all the property hereinafter described for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of improving South side of N Ave., from West curb line of Fourth Street to the East curb line of Oak Street by grading and placing thereon a standard 5 foot concrete sidewalk according to the plans and specifications therefore heretofore adopted by said Commission and on file in the office of the Recorder of said city.

That the real property included in and the boundaries of the district benefited and affected by said proposed improvement are as follows: Beginning at a point on the intersection of the center line of Fourth Street with the center line of "N" Avenue the boundary line runs thence west along the center line of "N" Avenue to the center line of Oak Street, thence south along the center line of Oak Street 80 feet to a point opposite the south property line of Lot 12 in Block 3 Wisdom's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon, thence east along the south property line of Lots 1 and 12 in Block 3 Wisdom's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon, to the center line of Cedar Street; thence south along the center line of Cedar Street to a point opposite the center of Block 78 of Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon; thence east and through the center of Blocks 78, 77, 76 and 75 of said Chaplin's Addition to a point west 100 feet from the west property line of Fourth Street; thence north to the southwest corner of lot 5 in Block 75 in Chaplin's said Addition; thence east to the center line of Fourth Street; thence north to the place of beginning—all in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and the estimated cost of said proposed improvement is \$1,327.19. You will further take notice that said City Commission will meet at the Commission Chamber in the City Building of said city on the 13th day of May, 1914, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. of said day to consider making said proposed levy and will then and there grant a hearing to any and all persons feeling aggrieved against, or on account of said proposed assessment.

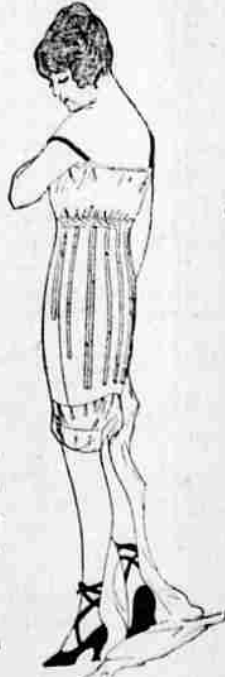
