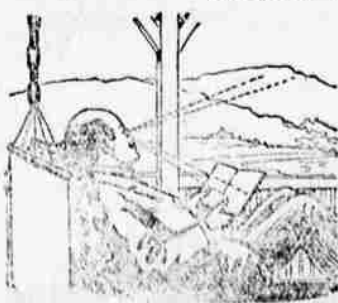

PENDLETON WINS MEET

CONKEY FOR LA GRANDE MAKES
GREAT SHOWING.

Javelin Record is Broken by Minnis
of Pendleton.

Wallowa, Oregon, May 4.—(Special).—In an interesting and fiercely contested contest, Pendleton High School won first honors in Eastern Oregon when its representatives won 42 points in the Eastern Oregon Track and Field meet here Saturday. Second honors went to La Grande who, owing to the efforts of Conkey, easily took second place with 29 points. Baker City took third honors with 22 1-2 points while Wallowa took fourth with 14 points. Enterprise won by 8 1-2 points over her nearest competitor, Ontario, who summed up 8 points. Prineville was next with 6 points, Joseph receiving one point. The towns which entered but did not score were: Adams, Lostine and Athena.

This 15th annual meet was the largest ever held and was a success with the exception of a slight breeze which made things rather dusty. One hundred Athletes took part in this meet, which exceeded any number attending other meets. Pendleton entered 17 men; Ontario 8; Joseph 6; La Grande 12; Adams 1; Prineville 4; Baker 15; Enterprise 11; Lostine 3; Athena 3; Wallowa 16.

The Northwest record for the Javelin was broken when Minis of Pendleton hurled it 153 feet 7 inches.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED STREET IMPROVEMENT.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You are hereby notified that the Committee on estimates appointed by the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, to make an examination of the property, upon which assessments are to be levied to pay the costs and expenses of the street improvement hereinafter described, as to the valuation and extent, if any of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvement, have made their report in writing to said council, which report has been received by said Commission and is on file in the office of the Recorder of said city, and is open for your inspection. That it is the intention of said Commission to levy a special assessment against all the property hereinafter described for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of improving South side of N Ave. from West curb line of Fourth Street to the East curb line of Oak Street by grading and placing thereon a standard 5 foot concrete sidewalk according to the plans and specifications therefore heretofore adopted by said Commission and on file in the office of the Recorder of said city.

That the real property included in and the boundaries of the district benefitted and affected by said proposed improvement are as follows: Beginning at a point on the intersection of the center line of Fourth Street with the center line of "N" Avenue the boundary line runs thence west along the center line of "N" Avenue to the center line of Oak Street, thence south along the center line of Oak Street 80 feet to a point opposite the south property line of Lot 12 in Block 3 Wisdom's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon, thence east along the south property line of Lots 1 and 12 in Block 3 Wisdom's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon, to the center line of Cedar Street; thence south along the center line of Cedar Street to a point opposite the center of Block 78 of Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon; thence east and through the center of Blocks 78, 77, 76 and 75 of said Chaplin's Addition to a point west 100 feet from the west property line of Fourth Street; thence north to the southwest corner of lot 5 in Block 75 in Chaplin's said Addition; thence east to the center line of Fourth Street; thence north to the place of beginning—all in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and the estimated cost of said proposed improvement is \$1,327.19. You will further take notice that said City Commission will meet at the Commission Chamber in the City Building of said city on the 13th day of May, 1914, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. of said
