**LA GRANDE MAN
SHIPS CATTLE**

ALASKA IS DESTINATION, AND
INAUGURATES NEW SCHEME.

Will Ship Consignment of Cattle and
Horses.

Probably the most unique manner of marketing cattle has been hit upon by J. D. McKennon. About May 30th he will ship out of Seattle seventy-five fat steers and thirty head of horses with Shashana, Alaska as destination point. Shashana is a new gold mining camp just discovered a

short time ago and is located 300 miles inland from Whitehorse.

Raymond McKennon will accompany the shipment, as also will F. C. Sharkey and wife of Portland, who take this manner of enjoying a summer vacation and coupling the same with business.

The idea is to ship from Seattle by boat to Skagway and from there to Whitehorse by rail. When Whitehorse will have been reached, the journey will only be started for there the thirty horses will be packed with supplies and the cattle driven overland (for there are no railroads in that part of Alaska) to Shashana. It will probably require from thirty to forty-five days to make the trip to the new mining camp, and the presumption is that the cattle will sell at a very high price as will also the horses.

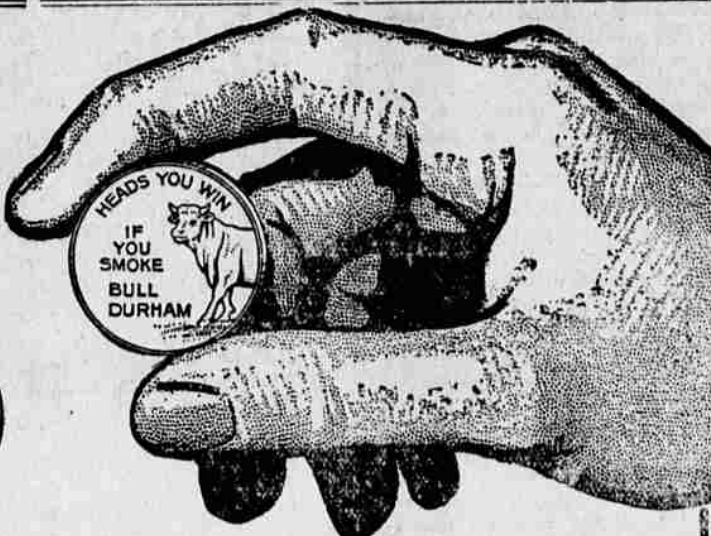

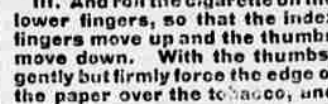

**How to
"Roll Your Own"**

I. In fingers of left hand, hold cigarette paper curved, so as to receive the tobacco. Pour right quantity of "Bull" Durham out of muslin sack with right hand, strewing tobacco evenly in paper.



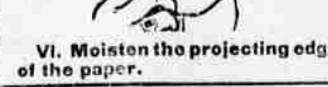
II. Then place your two thumbs next to each other in the middle of the paper in this position.



III. And roll the cigarette on the lower fingers, so that the index fingers move up and the thumbs move down. With the thumbs, gently but firmly force the edge of the paper over the tobacco, and



IV. Shape the cigarette by rolling it with the thumbs, as you draw them apart.



V. Hold the cigarette in your right hand, and



VI. Moisten the projecting edge of the paper.



VII. With fingers close ends of cigarette by twisting the paper, and you have a cigarette properly made, properly shaped and ready to smoke.
