Vegetable gardeners, although having experienced cold weather, are nursing their gardens around La Grande with extreme caution, and the general conditions indicate a very regular year here in the way of production of the usual good things to eat.

From neighboring states comes the information that fruit prospects are very good, that wheat is hundred per cent, that all kinds of hay will be plentiful and that while frost may have done some damage, there is going to be a bountiful crop of everything.
