Fresh cherries, grown in California, went on sale in La Grande today. The early shipments were fairly choice and were offered at 35 cents per pound.

Strawberries at Hood River. Hood River, May 13.—The first crate of strawberries for the season to be shipped from Hood River was shipped by Thomas Calkins, yesterday, for which he received \$10. Mr. Calkins owns a place on the river that is sheltered from the winds and is always the first grower in Hood River to bring berries into market. With the continuation of the present warm weather, berries will go forward in car lots in about two weeks more.
