**Hog Feeding Experiment.**

La Grande, Ore., May 15.—(To the Editor): In a recent issue of The Observer an article was printed in regard to hog feeding and in reading the article, I find that some of the figures inserted are incorrect and that some figures were omitted that should have been printed in order to give the article its just value. It is not the intention of the writer to furnish a complete result of the experiment or to draft any final conclusions, but merely to relate a few facts as they appear in the progress of the experiment, as this experiment will not be finished for some time. The idea in printing any thing at all along this line is to inform the interested farmers of the results as they are found, and the main feature or object of such experiments is to know exactly what the animals are gaining and the cost of such gains. Therefore great care should be exercised in printing such statements in order not to lose the value that is derived from the experiment. I take this opportunity to make some corrections and additions to the former article in order to give it the value that it should carry to the farmers who are interested in hog feeding.

Eighteen hogs were carefully selected in regard to breeding, size, sex, etc., and divided into two lots with a difference in the total weights of only four pounds. Individuals averaging right at 100 pounds. The lots were placed in pens side by side and given the same grain ration by means of self feeders. The housing, watering, and everything else the same, with alfalfa averaged 178 pounds except one pen had access to alfalfa pasture.

At the end of five weeks the hogs in the pen without alfalfa averaged 142 pounds, and the ones in the pen at the conclusion of the experiment every thing will be taken into consideration, the exact amount
