

SIREN FASCINATION MADE AN EMPIRE OF REPUBLICAN ROME

That the flash of a pair of brilliant eyes and the smile of a beautiful woman can change the history of a world is more than illustrated in George Klein's spectacular production of the Cines Photo drama masterpiece "Anthony and Cleopatra," which is announced for Wednesday at the Arcade.

of historic value can be gleaned from Mr. Klein's truly wonderful photo drama production. It is a series of exquisite pictures in which the principals are all famous historical characters and it acted with consummate skill. Anthony Novelli as Marc Anthony, and Signora Giovanna Terribili Gonzales as Cleopatra do such splendid acting before the camera that if portrayed in flesh and blood on the legitimate dramatic stage would cause them to be recognized among the very greatest actors of the world and undoubted favorites everywhere. Yet as actors before the camera, their fame will be perpetuated for ages, while on the stage it would almost be forgotten with the sound of their voices. Irrespective of all this, however, the point is—"Anthony and Cleopatra" is the photo drama supreme to date and commands the attention of everybody who searches for convincing realism in art, at the Arcade tomorrow only.
