These are principally Milton and Estacada berries, and the strawberry shelves will be well loaded down tomorrow, and at nominal prices besides. Saturday shoppers will have a fairly good line of goods to choose from for the vegetable goods are just in their prime, good waxed beans being one of the latest additions. Beans are still high, however, commanding 20 cents per pound.

Union Stockyards, Portland, May 29.—Hogs developed the expected weakness today, \$8.15 being quoted as top price, a drop of a dime. This was really the top yesterday, but the change in quotation was not made until late in the day. Cattle are steady, but little change is noted in sheep prices.
