MEAT PRICES SLIGHTLY OFF

MUTTON STEADY AND CATTLE UNCHANGED.

Hog Prices Show Slight Inclinations to Decline This Week.

Portland, June 3.—(Special)—Conditions in the mutton trade are generally considered steady, with no general change in the price or situation locally.

There were not enough cattle reported in the yards over night to cause the making of quotations. Just two head appeared. Trade in the cattle market at North Portland recently has been rather good for light stuff, but little of the best quality has been available.

The bulk of the sales show no change in values from last week's closing.

While sales of hogs were still being made at \$7.90 in the North Portland yards for the limited supply of best stuff that came forward, the market is really weaker and only a small supply over night kept the price from showing a further loss.
