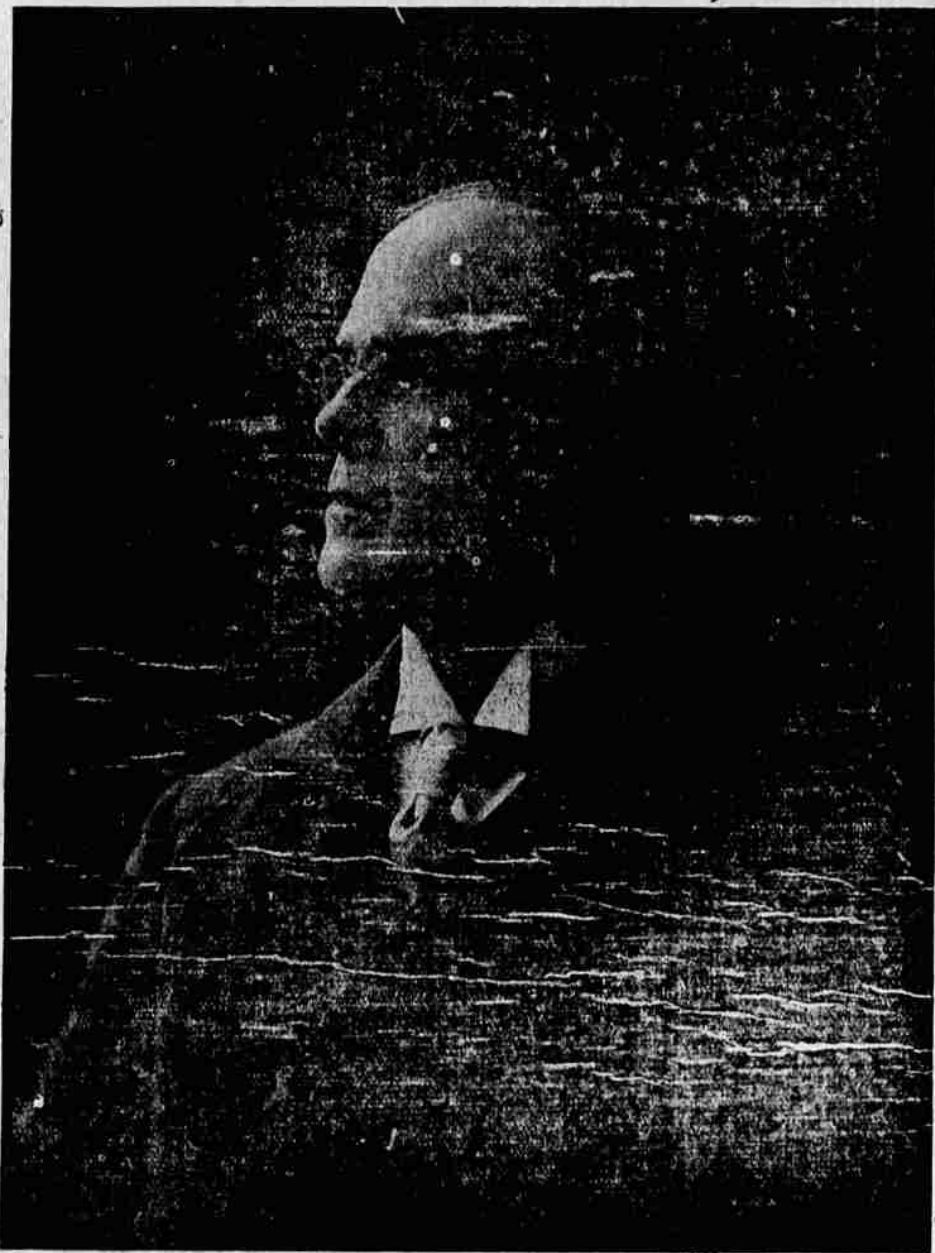


DR. G. L. HERBERT BRINGS LEARNED LECTURE ON "A MAN AMONG MEN" TO CHAUTAUQUA

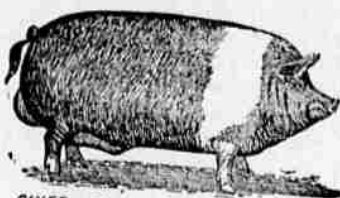

JOSEPH MAN WINS PRIZES

HAMPSHIRE HOGS TAKE RIBBONS EVERYWHERE.

Remarkable Success Attends Breeding of Hampshire Line.

J. M. Fruitts of Joseph has attained much fame as a breeder of prize-winning swine. Hampshire is the particular breed that he has the most success with and in the Northwest, his winners have often been shown.

At Walla Walla he was awarded the silver cup offered by the Northern Pacific Railroad company. At Spokane he was awarded 14 first premiums, 10 second premiums, five third premiums and two fourth premiums, besides several champion and grand champion prizes.

Among the swine he was awarded first on, were "Lonus," "Brush Up," "Rosebud," "Bowman Wonder." He also won first place on Hampshire pen class. "Lily of the Valley," No. 9754, which is the champion sow over four states, was also one of the prize winners at the Oregon state fair.

In 1912 Mr. Fruitts exhibited some of his Hampshires at the California state fair at Sacramento, where they were awarded some of the best premiums.

Mr. Fruitts has been a breeder of

Hampshire swine for the past four years, and by his intelligent methods of feeding and caring for his herd he is making a success of the live-stock industry, and his swine at the Oregon state fair was a credit to any state.

All dogs found running at large on the streets or alleys of La Grande on or after June 15 will be killed forthwith in accordance with said ordinance.
