The admiral estimated the casualties at about fifty. The New Orleans, he said rescued the survivors of the Tampico crew, and its surgeon attended the Gueroero's wounded.

It is feared the vessel is a total loss. The invalids were transferred in small boats which were near pending the arrival of other vessels summoned by wireless.
