# NO EFFECT OF CANAL IN 1914

**WHEAT SHIPS ALREADY CHARTERED IT SEEMS.**  
No Reduction in Freight Rates Will Show up This Season.

Portland, June 25.—(Special)—Several inquiries have come from the interior recently regarding the probable effect of the Panama canal upon this year's wheat prices and freight charges to Europe.

The fact that it will be practically impossible for sailing vessels to use the canal to advantage and that only a very small amount of steamer space has as yet been chartered, local grain exporters were today of the opinion that no benefits whatever would be derived by the producer.

Most of the ships that will be used this season in transporting the Pacific Northwest grain crop to Europe have already been chartered and there has been no provision whatever made regarding any lowering of rates providing the canal is in operation.

Those that have chartered steamers are making an attempt to secure a reduction providing the big ditch is used and are now negotiating with the owners regarding this. The fact that few steamers have been fixed therefore eliminates any chance of the grain securing any benefits, as sailing vessels always carry cargoes for less money than the steamers.

There is practically nothing doing in the spot wheat market at this time, as there is really nothing being offered. A small amount of contracting is reported in the interior for early delivery new crop with reports as high as 71c bushel at Pendleton. No late business has been confirmed.

But for a few minor markings the market prices remain about the same today. Some of the fruits as cherries and peaches show a few cents cheaper. Cherries are beginning to arrive in market in quantities and are being sold by the pound rather than by the box as the earlier varieties were.

**COWED THE CHINESE.**

On board a launch on which I was sailing up the Yangtze river were about thirty Chinese soldiers of such a ragamuffin appearance as to excite my suspicions, but fortunately without their rifles. As evening of the first day came on they crowded around the small deck house and demanded of the native agent to know what the "foreign devil" was doing here. Now, I had been cleaning and oiling the various parts of my sample machine gun during the day.

Before nightfall I drew the blinds of the deckhouse and, quickly assembling the gun, slipped in a loaded belt. I now told the agent, who was white with fear, to tell these fellows that this "foreign devil" "belong crazy" and also "hun lehl" (very fierce) and as a sort of warning to "keep off the grass" I opened the door and let off a string of about fifty shots into the air, at the same time giving the Yale college yell, which was the handiest warcry I could think of at the moment.

Whether it was the information imparted by the agent, Chen, the shots or the Yale cheer I cannot say, but all hands crowded to the other end of the launch and remained at a respectful distance until Nanchang was reached, to the great amusement of the Chinese captain and engineer, who, however, had deemed it good policy to allow the passengers to settle their own disputes without interference.
