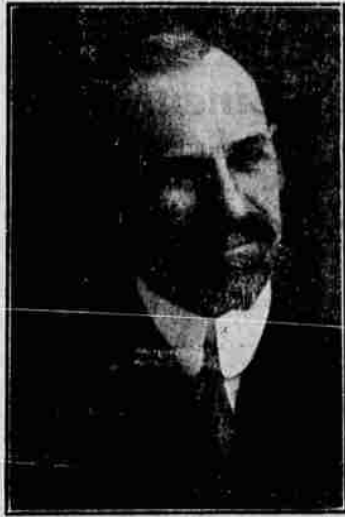


BRAINERD TO COME EARLY

OGDEN STUDENT WILL MANAGE PLATFORM.

When Chautauqua Opens Friday He Will Be Here.

When the annual chautauqua opens next Friday evening with Ng Poon Chew as the attraction, Dr. Frank G. Brainerd of Ogden will be here to conduct the platform.

Active platform management during the progress of the assembly this year will be performed by Mr. Brainerd, a Congregational minister of Ogden, Utah. In addition he will conduct the bible study and roundtable classes for adults and on Sundays will preach the morning sermons. Mr. Brainerd comes highly recommended to the local directors: He is a graduate of Oberlin and the Chicago theological seminary and has had a long service as a pastor. **Charity Work Extensive.**

As a charity worker he has had eight years of work finding friends and employment for prisoners, poor people and ex-convicts. In addition to coming to La Grande's chautauqua, he will appear at 42 different places during the summer.

He has kept in touch especially with three lines of thought expressed in lecture series: Special Subjects—"The Man with the Bundle," the story of a tragedy and hope of the ex-prisoner; "Our Human Animal, the Boy," a plea for the humanizing of the animal nature common to all boys brought about only by a truer understanding and more intelligent appreciation of the so-called "has been" and the disappointing boy; "The Making of a Man," a study of auto-suggestions and a plea for the planning of life and its selfmaking by careful selection and use of all materials and possibilities at hand; "Society and the Individual," a discussion of mutual obligations with special reference to the menace of poverty, physical defect and immorality. These are all illustrated by numerous incidents drawn from personal association during these ten years of charity work supplemented by 17 years of posterates in widely varying and distant localities. They have furnished a and illustration that is, to say the least, unique.
