Pendleton-Spokane Train Wrecked.
Pendleton-Spokane northbound passenger train No. 8 was wrecked this morning near Spofford station, a few miles this side of Walla Walla when the engine and four cars left the track as a result of a broken rail. But little damage was caused and no one was injured. The track where the accident occurred was on level ground and consequently the cars did not overturn. Evidently some trouble was had in getting the cars back up on the track as a wrecking train was made up here this afternoon and left for the scene several hours after the trouble occurred.—East Oregonian.
