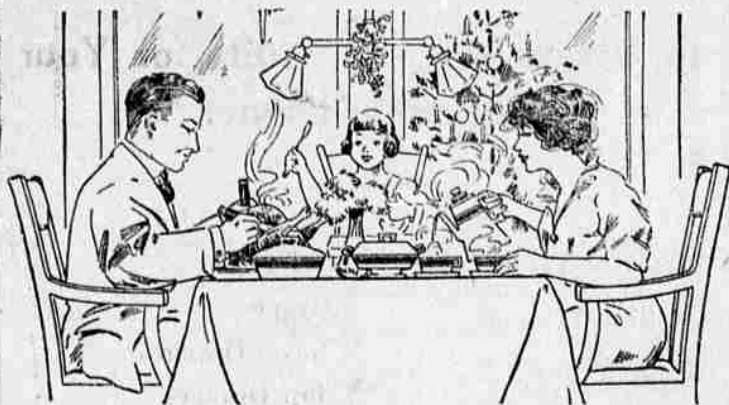
John Spain Wins Damages.

Baker, Ore., Dec. 21.—A jury in the circuit court returned a verdict awarding \$1522 damages to John Spain, former champion buckaroo of the world in his suit against the O. W. R. & N. railroad company. Spain alleged that he was illegally arrested and taken from a train at Huntington on charge of intoxication; that con-

flement in the Huntington jail resulted in his catching cold, necessitating amputation of his right hand, which was injured in a roping contest in Pine Valley in 1912. The verdict giving the ex-broncho buster king damages was signed by only nine of the 12 jurors. Spain sued for \$5000.

BOSTON WANTS TO BE A HOG

FURTHERMORE, DEMANDS ARE SUBSTANTIATED

Local Sport Items of Various Descriptions Cited.

New York, Dec. 22.—What Chicago has done, dead old Boston may find possible to do. Having hogged all the championships and titles wellnigh possible Boston looks to be headed for both first and second places in the baseball world in 1915. It is far from being beyond the bounds of probability that the World Series conflict will be staged altogether in The Hub.

The two Chicagos pulled the stunt of grabbing off the American and National League championships and therefore all the World Series swag some years back. Bostonians are whooping it up just now for annihilation of the trick by their two ball teams. Of course everyone knows how violently pro-Boston all Bostonians are, but even those persons who are not fortunate to live within the boundaries of this center of culture, football, baseball and rowing, must admit that this time the Boston argument is good.

With the old Athletics greatly weakened and nine-tenths of the Washington nine pitching for the Chicago Federals, Boston looks to be the one best bet—on paper—for next year, in the American League struggle. As for the season's campaign in the National all the Braves have to do to repeat is to play throughout the summer months just seventy-five per cent the quality of baseball they played in the closing weeks last year, and they'll center home with a comfortable margin between them and the runner-up.

Harvard is said to be considering taking on the Army for her 1915 football program. Such a game would make the schedule of the Army team harder than it was last fall. The report recalls the terrific schedule which both Army and Navy used to arrange some years back. It has only been recent that the athletic authorities at the West Point and Naval Academies decided against the practice of taking on Harvard, Yale, Princeton or Cornell and Pennsylvania.
