COACH OLSAN DRILLS CANDIDATES HARD.

Exact Lineup Will Probably Not be Known for Several Days.

La Grande high is drilling its basketball players for the opening game of the season with Joseph, set for December 30. Joseph, by the way, is touted as having magnificently improved in form over last year and to all appearances, will give La Grande a hard rub, more particularly so in view of the fact that the La Grande quint has not gotten under way properly to date.

Just who Coach Olsan will send against the Josephites, will be determined within the next few days. He has a fairly good squad which will round into form a little later, but only a few are showing particular promise at this time, with the result that the hard work done the next few days will to a great extent determine who shall represent the school in the opening game.

State Officials Arrested.

Hermiston, Or., Dec. 22.—(Special.)—The arrest and conviction of three prominent Hermiston citizens upon a charge of hunting ducks after sundown and the filing of charges against two county officials on a similar charge has given indications that the game authorities are enforcing the protection given by law to the water fowls between sundown and sunup. Yesterday John Roberts, M. J. Butler and Freeman Smith were found guilty before Justice of the Peace E. P. Dodd. All three were members of the same hunting party arrested Saturday evening at 5:15 by Special Deputy J. S. West. That day the official time for sundown was 4:10. Smith was fined \$25 and costs amounting to \$5 and sentence against the other two was suspended upon the understanding that each would pay one-third of the fine.

On the same evening, J. T. Hinkle, local attorney and representative from this county, and Dr. H. S. Garfield of Pendleton, county coroner, were charged in a complaint by Special Deputy W. O. Whitsett with shooting at ducks at 5:30 in the evening. They will fight the case which will probably be set for trial next week. District Warden Averill was here yesterday.
