NORTH POWDER BEEF HEAVY

TWO YEAR OLD HEIFER WEIGHS
NEARLY 800 DRESSED.

Union County Produces Choice Meats
for Local Markets.

What many stockmen and meat dealers declare to be a record two-year-old heifer, was purchased from McGregor of North Powder by the Grande Ronde Meat company yesterday, and the huge carcass is being displayed in the shop today. The total weight of the dressed animal was 780 pounds. The average weight of a heifer, as this was, at the age of two years is under 600 pounds, though it is not unusual to see a two-year old weigh 600. However, a 780 pounder at the age of two years is admitted to be extraordinary.

The monster animal has been decorated with the butcher's art and is attracting considerable attention.

That some fancy mutton is being raised in the valley is shown by the display of mutton and lamb in the various markets of the city today. Don Ruckman sold a shipment of lambs to local meat dealers last evening that are classed as exceptionally fine. Thus another foodstuff from the confines of Union county takes precedence over imported goods—no better mutton can be had than that produced in this county.

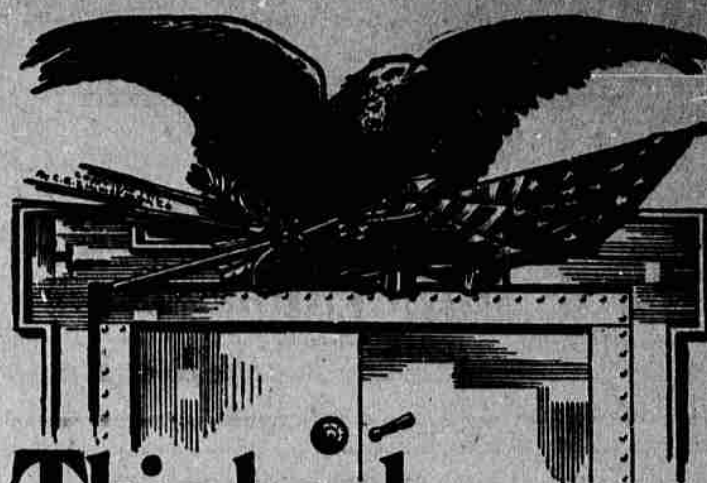
