NOTICE is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of the west side of Walnut street, from the north curb line of Main Avenue to the south curb line of Washington Avenue, being district No. 97 of the City of La Grande, Oregon, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 806, Series 1914. "An Ordinance declaring
