CATTLE REACH HIGH FIGURE

FINE STEERS BRING \$8.00 ON PORTLAND MARKET.

Hogs Take Slight Decline as Cattle Prices Mount Upward.

Portland Union Stockyards, Dec. 28. --Cattle reached the highest price here this morning that has been in effect in months, when three lots of fine steers sold at \$8. This is an advance of 25 cents over the top paid at any time last week and 50 cents over the general run of prices in effect throughout the week. The steers sold at the new top figure were extra fancy stuff. Cattle sales this morning were the heaviest in a long time. Small receipts last week caused a big demand and this is held responsible for the healthy advance of this morning.

While steers were going up the price ladder, cows were not far behind. All last week \$6 was the top, but this went up to \$6.85 today, with a number of sales at this figure. The competition was keen and prices advanced steadily throughout the buying of the forenoon.

The hog market lost its lead over all other swine markets of the United States when the price dropped a dime this morning, the new top being \$7.30. This is 5 cents under Chicago, but a dime over South Omaha. Receipts were not as heavy as a week ago, which was a good thing, as the demand was lighter than it has been in weeks.

In the sheep houses, the market remains steady, although the sales made were under top prices with the exception of yearlings, which brought the full market quotation of \$6.

For the first time in months a sale of a calf at \$8.50, the top, was made. Receipts this morning consisted of 536 cattle, 3 calves, 2107 hogs and 1137 sheep, a total of 45 cars.
