SINGING CLUB IN THE CITY

In charge of Graduate Manager Tiffany, who is also Oregon's registrar, the University of Oregon Glee club arrived this morning from Baker where they met with signal success last evening. Henry Haldenrich and Merle Eately who are very prominent in the club, visited with relatives and friends during the day. Some idea of how the club succeeds this year is given by the Pendleton East Oregonian critic. After praising the "introductory numbers," he goes on to say of the performance there two nights ago:

"Part No. 2 was something new in Glee club programs. It was an exploitation of the university in song and picture and it was most effectively done. With the club singing the college songs behind the curtain a stereopticon lantern from the gallery threw on the screen pictures of the beautiful campus of the university, and there was more than one Oregon alumnus in the audience who felt the pang of homesickness as the views of the familiar vine-covered buildings and the 'shady place' on the old mill race were set to music before him."

At the close of the program the high-maker, a skit "The Glee Club," by Bertrand Haldenrich, a Pendleton native, was of comic entertainers who would look well on the big vaudeville stage. Both are national stunt men and their fun last evening was also fun for the crowd. Their songs on the "Perils of Pauline" and "The Little Old Ford" were real hits and the boys found it difficult to leave the stage after their supply of songs and jokes had been exhausted.

"Taken all in all, the 'rah rah' boys gave Pendleton one of the most enjoyable entertainments of the year and, as long as they furnish programs like that of last evening they will not want for an audience here." The club will perform this evening at Sherry's theatre, the curtain call being set for 8:15. Although a majority of the best seats are taken, there are still some suitable accommodations in the seat line to be had.
