UNION ATHLETIC CLUB WILL
MAKE M. I. A. GO.

Candidates for Teams in League Get
Out and Show Class.

Monday night the M. I. A. goes up against the Union Athletic club at the high school gym and this promises to be the fastest game of the season, as this club last year claimed the Eastern Oregon Championship but were defeated by the M. I. A. at La Grande by a very large score and the M. I. A. were defeated on the Union floor by a margin of 14 points after having pushed and pulled through mud from two to three feet deep on their way over in autos.

The Union team is composed of the two Horns, Goodbrod the fast forward of the Union high school of two years ago, besides several others of local fame.

In the M. I. A. team will be seen many old heads and some new men who have been drilling like coal miners trying to make good to take the place of many who will retire after this year. Farley will be at the center position, with Woods, A. Bean, and Metcalf as guards, with Stoddard, Ainsworth, Baum, and Larsen as forwards.

Manager Larsen says, "we have a well oiled and drilled machine where a new man can take the place of another without the usual break up of the team work. Prospects for the Eastern Oregon championship for 1915 have never looked better than they do at present for us. The game Monday night will see at least 10 of our men on play at different periods of the game. Perhaps the fastest team that we will play this year is the Walls Walla Y. M. C. A. who have twice defeated the Echo Giants. We hope to win the game Monday night not without using every ounce of ginger that is within us."

The O-W 'shop' basketball team fully expects to be in the first division in the coming tournament. The material is developing very fast, being helped greatly by several ex-college players coming in the line light. The guard positions lie between Horstman, Ainsworth, Sherman and Duninard.

Center lies between Robertson, Stanchfield, Reed and Dunenard. The forwards who are practically the team's best men will be Mason, Crawley and Reed.

At the outset of the La Grande-Amateur Basketball league the city team was looked upon as the one which would need nursing to keep in the running, but since the candidates have been out for practice, the buggaboo has been scared away. It is clear that other teams in the league must now look for power if they win over the clerks.
