GETS BIG PRICE**

**ELGIN FORWARDING COMPANY  
BUYS CROP.**

Enterprise Man Disposes of His Wheat For \$1.25 This Week.

Two thousand bushels of wheat were contracted this week by George P. Faught to be sold to the Elgin Forwarding company at \$1.25 a bushel. Delivery will be made next week, says the Enterprise Chieftain.

Mr. Faught for several years has been a shrewd seller of his wheat. He has made a practice of holding it in the fall, and waiting for the high spring prices. Thus he has got 20 to 25 cents a bushel more than others who sold at threshing time. In the middle of last summer he concluded wheat was going up before spring and said he would not sell until he fixed the price at \$1.25. This price was fixed the middle of the week and he was called on to "come through."

Wheat has been close to \$1.50 in Portland this week, and the larger operators expect it to go still higher.
