MEAT RUN IS NEAR RECORD

EXTREMELY BRISK BUSINESS DONE AT PORTLAND.

Prices Maintained an Even Tone During Stiff Business.

Union Stockyards, Portland, Jan. 12.—While receipts were not quite as heavy Monday morning as a week ago, still a total of 9595 head of livestock came in. This is not a record but counts as one of the best days in the history of the local yards. Sales were brisk and prices were well maintained. More than 28000 head were disposed of up to 11:30 this morning, and at that time it looked as though the sales would reach a record.

While prime light steers sold a week ago at \$8, the price yesterday morning was from 10 to 15 cents under. The best stuff brought \$7.85 with prime cows selling at \$6.75, a sales were heavy throughout.
