POTATO TRADE IS NOT GOOD

SELECT QUALITY SPUD IS SCARCE HOWEVER.

Extent of Damage to Yakima Output Has Not Been Determined.

Portland, Jan. 15. While select spuds show the greatest scarcity known here for many years at this season, there is little of moment in the trade.

While the Front street market is showing strength and values are ruling us high as \$1.25 a cental for extra select offerings of retailers, the outside demand is at low ebb.

Shipments to California are unusually limited and there is little inclination among buyers acting for that account to take hold except upon the receipt of actual orders. The southwest is not a bidder for potatoes here because other places are selling for less.

While confirmation is shown that severe damage has been done the potato crop of the Yakima section, still the extent of the damage is not yet known. Rejections of Yakima stock are still reported from Puget Sound markets and some of the inferior stock has been offerings in this trade. Good Yakima stock is holding firm as is good quality from all other sections.
