HEEF STEADY AND UNCHANGED AT PORTLAND.

Imported Flour Has Gone up Five Cents Per Sack.

**IMPORTED FLOUR UP.**

Another five cents was added to imported flour yesterday, bringing all brands up to a record mark. The corrected figures are given below.

Union Stockyards, Portland, Jan. 18.—While the cattle and sheep markets were reported today as steady and unchanged, the hog market was "up in the air" and up to 1:30 this afternoon no stated quotation was available.

The best sale was at \$6.90, or 10 cents under Saturday's top, and this is supposed to be the high price now in effect.

There is absolutely nothing certain about the top and the market is in an unsettled condition, owing to tremendously heavy receipts, more than 8000 head of hogs waiting to be sold.
