TRACK-LAYING RESUMED.

Enterprise Company Takes Up Activities Afield Again.

Tracklaying was resumed by the East Oregon Lumber company on its railroad yesterday morning, says the Enterprise Record-Chief. New equipment for use in this work arrived a few days earlier, and on Tuesday a crew of 21 tracklayers came in from Spokane. These are the same men who were working for the company last summer when the first track was laid. They have spent the winter in Spokane.

It will take a month and a half to lay the track to the company's small sawmill in the edge of the reserve. In a few days after that, the lumber and timbers cut last summer for the large plant in Enterprise can be hauled to town on the railroad. Then a large crew of carpenters will be put to work constructing the plant. President I. H. Fetty is anxious to complete the mill and get to sawing as soon as possible.

For some weeks the company has been preparing quietly to get to work on the railroad without waiting for spring and warm weather to return. The tracklayers were waiting to turn whenever there should be employment for them. But more equipment was needed. Two convertible ballast cars were bought, one common flat car and a caboose improvised out of a box car.
