EGGS ARE LOWER THAN IN YEARS

CONTINUED MILD WINTER HOLDS UP SUPPLY.

Fresh Ranch Eggs at 35 Cents Considered Unusually Low.

Continued mild winter weather has kept the supply of fresh ranch eggs above the demand and another drop of five cents per dozen for the strictly fresh ranch variety was recorded this morning, when a price of 35 cents per dozen was quoted. Not for several years have eggs—strictly fresh, home grown eggs—been so cheap at this season of the year, and the supply is liberal enough to meet an increased demand which should be created by the lower price. There is practically no demand for case eggs.

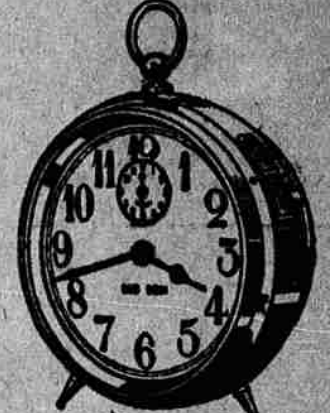

MINIMUM WAGE.

The minimum wage for women has come. You will have to meet it. And why shouldn't you meet it? What harm is it going to do to you if every merchant has to pay the same wage? It becomes precisely as other expense accounts. Hitherto the law of supply and demand fixed the wage schedule. Henceforth it will be efficiency, and if the cost of selling is increased the purchaser is the one who will pay. An eight hour law for employees is pending in some states. When this law first came in our state we thought it was very drastic. Time has proved the wisdom of this law. Merchants have adapted themselves to it. Business proceeds with ever increasing prosperity, and we are scarcely conscious of ever having worked without an eight hour law in effect.—Arthur Letts of Los Angeles, Cal., Head of Two Large Dry Goods Houses.
