OREGON MAY BE MADE BIGGER

PART OF ASOTIN COUNTRY MAY BE ADDED.

Unnatural Division Between Oregon and Washington Draws Notice.

That the extreme Northwest part of Oregon may have an appendix attached, is possible, and for long has been desired by people in the vicinity. Many people do not know, unless their attention is called to it, that there is Washington territory South of the Grande Ronde river. Hunters and others who have chased grouse up and down the draws North of Paradise and Flora, know that they have to keep back of an imaginary line at one point to avoid taking out another license. The strip of land is described in the following recent dispatch from Salem:

If a bill introduced in the House today by Representative W. A. Jones, of Joseph accomplishes its ultimate object about 250 square miles will be cut off the southern edge of Asotin, Garfield and Columbia counties, in Washington, and tacked on a Wallowa County, Oregon.

The present boundary line between the two states is determined by the 46th parallel of latitude, but Representative Jones' plan is to fix the line by natural boundaries; instead. He would start at the point where the two states intersect with the Idaho line and follow the Snake River to its junction with the Grande Ronde, then follow approximately, the summit of the Blue Mountains, to the present state line. The proposed change would effect a strip of territory about 50 miles long and two miles wide in places to 10 in others. It is sparsely settled and contains but little taxable property. The principal population is in a district known as Grouse Valley. The people in that district are prevented from trading in the state of Washington by natural barriers. They get their mail at postoffices in Oregon and the children attend school in this state. If the House and Senate pass the Jones bill the State of Washington and the Federal Congress will have to concur in the action to make it effective.
