EACH PASTOR TO PREPARE ESSAY ON GREAT MEN

Ministerial Association Takes Steps to Obtain Church Census.

Further plans to obtain a church census of La Grande was taken at the last meeting of the ministerial association of this city. This was the second meeting since the organization was formed, and the report of the organization and constitutional committee was received and accepted. The ministers will have printed 2500 cards upon which to take the census, and the work will be prosecuted vigorously.

The ministers also outlined a policy

for future meetings, in which it will be the purpose to have each minister prepare papers on biographies of great preachers, each speaker to select his own choice. These papers will be read in the following order: Rev. Clark of the Presbyterian church, Rev. Myers of the Christian, Rev. Lumber of Southern Methodists, Rev. Fyke of the Methodist, Rev. Drahn of the Lutheran and Rev. Close of the Baptist. A portion of the constitution, showing scope and purposes of the association, follows:

ART. I.

Name—The name of this association shall be "The Ministerial Association of La Grande, Oregon."

ART. II.

Purpose—The purpose of this association shall be to cultivate the spirit of Fraternity and Comity among the churches and to conserve the general well-being of the community, in things civic, social and moral.

ART. III.

Membership—Any resident ordained minister or Y. M. C. A. Secretary, affiliated with any of the recog-

nized orthodox branches of Protestantism in La Grande, or vicinity, may become a member of this association according to the following requirements: Each applicant for membership must subscribe to the following statement:—"I accept the Bible as the only infallible rule of Faith and Morals and as the only true Word of God; I accept Jesus Christ as God's only Son, the World's only Savior who is the great Head of the Church and whose authority is supreme."

ART. IV.

Officers—The officers of this association shall be a President, a Vice President and a Secretary-Treasurer. These officers to serve for a period of one year from the date of election or until their successors have been chosen.

ART. V.

Meetings—This association shall meet in the Y. M. C. A. building on the second Monday of each month, from September to June, at 10:30 a. m.

ART. VI.

Call Meetings—This association shall meet on the call of the president or on the request of three members of the association.

ART. VII.

Quorum—Three members present shall constitute a quorum.
