HOGS HIGHER, CATTLE DOWN

OFFERINGS AT PORTLAND MON-
DAY BELOW NORMAL.

However, Enough Comes Forward to
Meet the Demands Readily.

Portland Union Stockyards, Feb. 21.
—Receipts were not as heavy today as a week ago, but at that they were ample. There was a noticeable weakness in cattle prices, but hogs were lifted a nickel, with sheep steady and strong.

Cattle sales were inclined to be light today, although there appeared to be a fair demand. In the early sales \$7.25 was the best price paid, but it was believed fancy prime steers would command a higher price before the close of the market.

Over 500 head of hogs were disposed of before 10:30 o'clock this morning, with \$6.75 as the top price. This makes the local market the highest of all. Chicago was second, with \$6.70 the top, and South Omaha sent out a quotation of \$6.60.
