The saccharified globule of the family spud is out of the season, as it were, but persists in coming to the front with a very fair sample of its real self occasionally; such was the condition today and a very fair quality was put up for sale. However, the sweet potato is on its last legs.

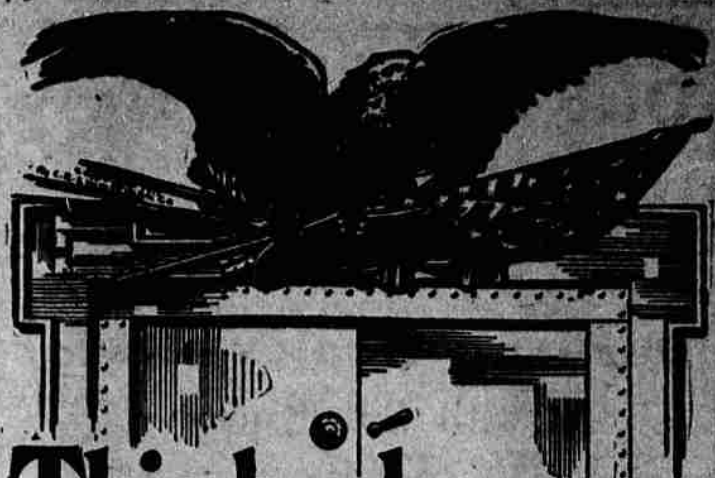
