## GREENHOUSE NEEDS ROOM

### FLORAL INSTITUTION HAS MANY VEGETABLE PLANTS

Easter Lillies, Represented by 300 Pots, Await the Season's Trade.

An industry in La Grande that was not born to blush unseen is the floral and seed business.

When A. B. Cherry organized the La Grande Seed and Floral company the start was made with a small house 16x30 feet containing but 500 square feet of glass. Three houses are now used with a total of 10,000 square feet of glass.

Like all growing greenhouse enterprises the company is now crowded for room and has sacrificed a large number of pot plants this season in order to make room for the new 1915 crop of carnations. Until the company can erect more buildings it will be almost necessary to discontinue the growing of pot plants for the entire available space must be devoted to cut flowers.

A recent visit to the greenhouse found Mr. Cherry in the midst of transplanting cabbage and other vegetable plants. These are grown by the thousands in order to have them ready for the spring customers who wish to plant their gardens from healthy plants.

Easter Lillies Attract. The La Grande Seed and Floral company is much interested at the present time with its Easter lillies. About 300 in pots are doing nicely

for the Easter trade although the cloudy days of winter have retarded their progress slightly. It is admitted by Mr. Cherry that considerable "forcing" will be necessary to bring the lily blooms out on time.

The greenhouse business in La Grande, as elsewhere requires work and plenty of it. Not merely manual labor, although there is quite a bit of it, but there must be constant study applied to the business. In speaking of this feature Mr. Cherry said: "It is interesting work, but I want to say it is real work and don't forget it. To sit at a desk and watch the other fellow do the work is only a dream of the greenhouse man. At the store now located in the Gardiner building we handle the retail end of the business. There we keep in stock the seeds. Our seed business was started in a small way but it has outgrown our most sanguine expectations. We carry all standard seeds in bulk and we believe we are the only store outside of Portland in the state carrying such a complete line."

But Mr. Cherry does not do all the work by any means for Mrs. Cherry is as deeply interested in the business as her husband. She handles the office end largely and it is her artistic ability that arranges and shapes the many beautiful funeral designs put out by the firm.

### High Bounty On Coyote Scalps.

Oregon is now paying a higher bounty on coyote scalps than any state in the union, according to Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, who is in Eastern Oregon on a tour of inspection.

The recent legislature passed a bill providing for the payment of three dollars on all coyotes killed after the law was passed and the bill carried an emergency clause which put it into effect on May 6, though coyotes killed six months prior to that date and held until May 6 will draw the bounty.
