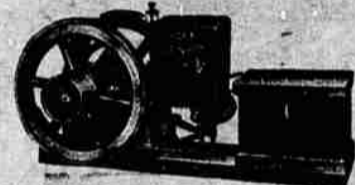

Our Bible School Contest. This Sunday marks a step forward in our Bible School work. We begin a contest with the bible schools at Pendleton and Baker. These schools are now about equal in number and in efficiency and we think that none stands a better show to win in the contest than our own school providing that we enter the contest in the right spirit and work with the proper amount of zeal and enthusiasm. This contest will not only test our ability but will test our mettle. The schools at Pendleton and Baker are determined not to come out loser; but some one in the end must and shall lose. In the end one of these schools will stand at the bottom of the list, and the list will be published in all of our church papers. The vital point is this: where will our school stand at the close of the contest. It depends on us. Each week the progress of each school will be posted where all can see. Let us see to it that we all do our very best, not only to win in the contest, but to elevate the plan upon which our school is living. Let this week be the beginning of a great move upward and forward for us. The points of the contest are as follows:

1. Each pupil in attendance counts one point. The count is to be taken at 10:20 a. m. each Sunday. The school begins at 9:45 so a fair degree of promptness is necessary in this contest.

2. Each penny in the offering counts one point. Let every student make a little larger offering.

3. Each pupil who also attends church services following the Sunday school counts one point. Most of our Sunday school scholars already have this habit so here is where we have a point to our advantage.

These three points are all that count in the contest. There are other points that make for efficiency that are not to be reckoned in this contest. But it will be noticed that this includes a very simple plan and there will be little room for a misunderstanding between the various schools, so there will be little room for confusion on the part of our own people.

Keep this article to refer to whenever you want to make sure of the points of the contest. Also take other copies to pass along to prospective scholars for our school. Let us work as if everything depended on us and pray as if everything depended on God, then we are sure of doing a work well pleasing unto Him, and very satisfactory to ourselves.
