HANDSOME TROPHY GIVEN TO HIGHEST SHOT

Rules Governing Shoot have been Promulgated by DuPonts.

The DuPont people for whom Gilbert is now demonstrating, have arranged the rules governing the Fred Gilbert anniversary and here are a few of the rules and suggestions:

Any club may hold a "Fred Gilbert Shoot."

March 13th to 20th, both days inclusive, has been designed as "Fred Gilbert Week."

Each club has the privilege of naming the day on which it will hold its "Fred Gilbert Shoot," but it must be during the period from March 13th to 20th.

There must be at least 10 contestants shooting through the program.

To such clubs as agree to comply with these and the following conditions we will send a handsome "Fred Gilbert" loving cup, which is suitably inscribed to commemorate the occasion.

Clubs receiving "Fred Gilbert" cups are expected to render a report of the contest for the same. Said contest should give the name and address of the winner, his score and the powder he used, and the names and scores of all other contestants.

Each club may arrange a contest for the "Fred Gilbert" cup such as will be satisfactory to its members, but we suggest that it be shot for on some handicap basis, which will give all contestants an equal opportunity of winning. Interstate Association rules should govern the contests.
