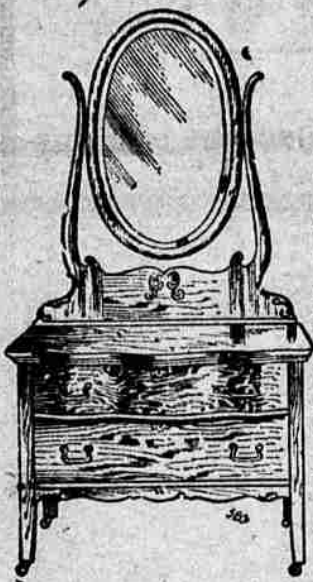

Marble Pudding

Steamed puddings will not be heavy if

2 cups sifted pastry flour; 2 level tea-

spoonful cinnamon; 1 teaspoonful salt;
yolks of 2 eggs, beaten light; 1 cup sugar;
1 tablespoonful melted butter; 1 cup
cold water; whites of 2 eggs, beaten dry;
1 1/2 ounces melted chocolate.

Sift together, three times, the flour, bak-
ing powder, salt and cinnamon. To the
yolks add the sugar, butter and water, and
stir into the dry ingredients. Add the whites
of the eggs. Divide the mixture into two
parts and add the chocolate to one part.
Dispothe two parts in a buttered mold
to give a marbled
appearance. Steam
forty-five minutes.



Vanilla Sauce

Boil 2 cups of sugar and a cup of
water six minutes; add 2 tablespoonfuls
of butter and a teaspoonful of vanilla
extract.

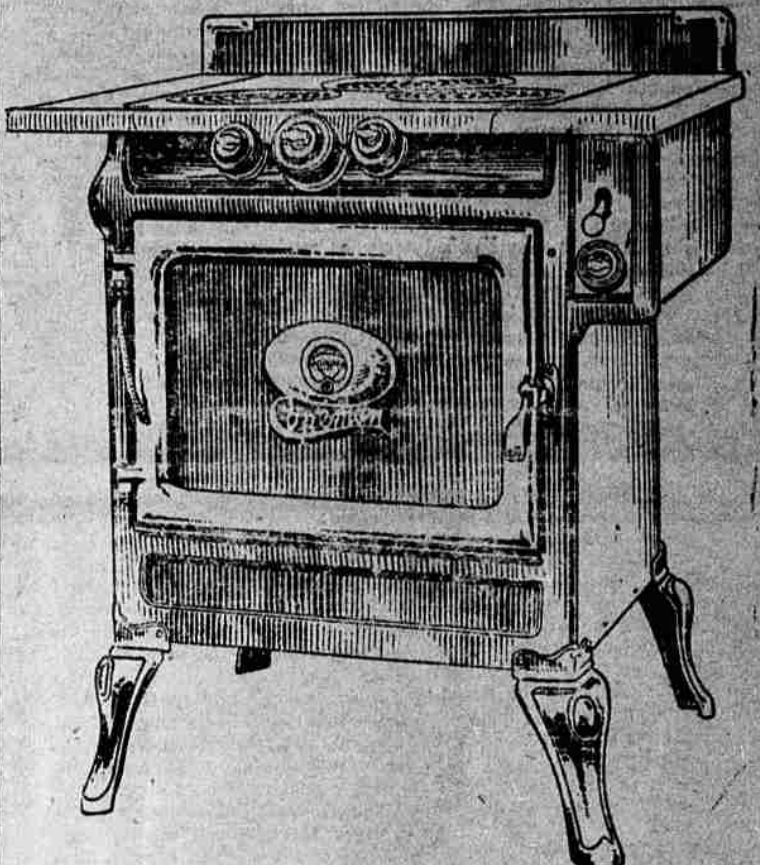
