The stores in La Grande have a fine line, and it is proposed to sell a large quantity of them tomorrow. Every shopper should include oranges on her list. Thus La Grande will help California for her part in helping on Apple day. Speaking of the preparations on O. W. dining cars, Local Agent J. H. Keeney said today:

"This idea comes from California, whose desire is to proclaim to the world its bounteous crop of citrus fruit."

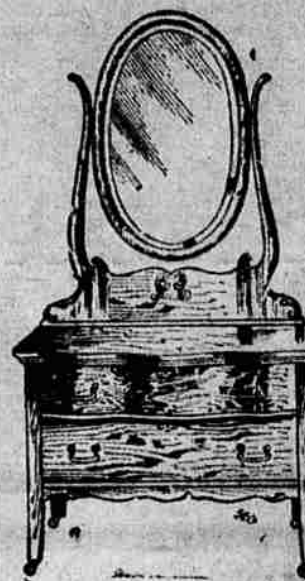

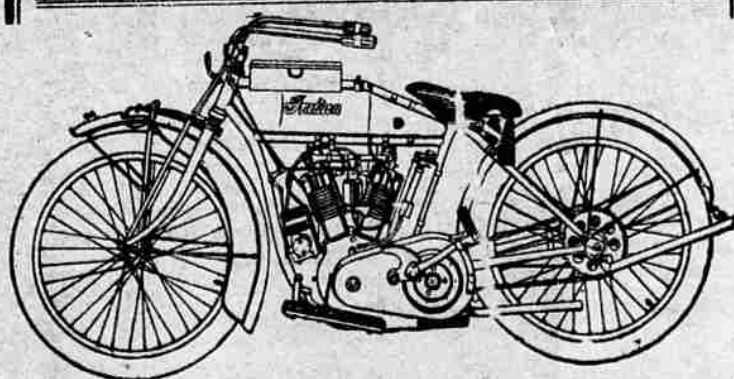
